Safety Instructions

Power

When not used for extended periods of time, set your PC to DPMS. If using a screen saver, set it to the active screen mode.

If the size of your monitor is small, or if the same image is present for long periods of time, you may see afterimages due to damage to the fluorescent substance on the inside of the TFT-LCD.

Do not use a damaged or loose plug.
This may cause an electric shock or fire.

Do not pull the plug out by the wire nor touch the plug with wet hands.
This may cause an electric shock or fire.

Use only a properly grounded plug and receptacle.
An improper ground may cause electric shock or equipment damage.

Do not excessively bend the plug and wire nor place heavy objects upon them, which could cause damage.
Failure to do so may cause an electric shock or fire.

Disconnect the plug from the outlet during storms or lightning or if it is not used for a long period of time.
Failure to do so may cause an electric shock or fire.

Do not connect too many extension cords to plugs to an outlet.

Installation

Do not cover the vents on the monitor cabinet.

Clean

When cleaning the monitor case or the surface of the TFT-LCD , wipe with a slightly moistened, soft fabric.

Do not spray detergent directly on the monitor. Use the recommended detergent with a smooth cloth.

If the connector between the plug and the pin is dusty or dirty, clean it properly with a dry cloth.

A dirty connector can cause an electric shock or fire.

Do not set liquids, chemicals or any small metal objects on the monitor. This may cause damage, electric shock or a fire. If a foreign substance gets into the monitor, disconnect the plug and then contact a service center.

Front

1. Power button:
Use this button to turn the monitor on and off.

2. Remote control receiver

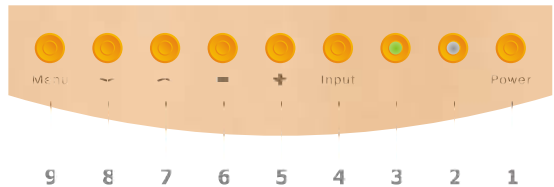
3. Power indicator:
This light glows green during normal operation.

4. Input button: Use this button to specify the input of the video signal.
5-6. Adjust button: These buttons allow you to adjust the value the menu. When the OSD is not active, these buttons will adjust the speakers volume.

7. Up-button: Navigation up.

8. Down-button: Navigation down.

9. Menu button: Use this button to activate the OSD and activate a highlighted menu item and exit function.



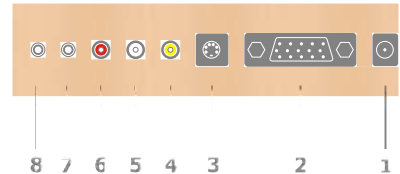

Introduction

Rear

The configuration at the back of the monitor may vary from product to product.

1. Power port
2. VGA-Signal port
3. S-Video port
4. Composite Video port
5. Audio-in left
6. Audio-in right
7. Audio-in from PC
8. Audio-out from Monitor

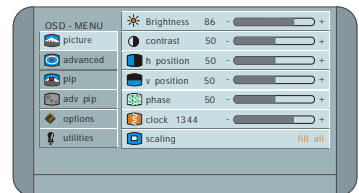
Connecting The Monitor

1. Connect the power cord for the monitor to the power port on the back of the monitor. Plug the power cord for the monitor into a nearby outlet.
2. Connect the VGA-signal cable to the VGA D-sub connector on the back of the monitor, or connect the monitor to another device through the S-video or Composite Video ports
3. If you are using a Macintosh computer, connect the cable to a Macintosh adapter, and set the pins on your adapter (Adapter not included). PC-compatible computers do not need an adapter.
4. When connecting to a computer, turn on the computer and monitor. If the monitor displays an image, installation is complete.

Navigate the OSD

How to navigate the OSD menu?

1. Push the Menu button to enter the OSD menu.
2. Use the up/down buttons to select a main category.
3. Push the Menu button to enter the main category you selected in the step 2.
4. Use the up/down buttons to select the sub category you want to adjust.
5. Use the +/- button to adjust to a desired value.
6. Push the Menu button to exit the category and push the Menu button again to exit the OSD.

Troubleshooting

Check List

Before calling for service, check the information in this section to see if you can remedy any problems yourself. If you do need assistance, please contact your dealer or visit our homepage <http://www.swedx.com>.

Symptom	Check list	Solution
No images on the screen. I can't turn on the monitor.	Is the power cord connected properly?	Check the power cord connection and supply.
	Can you see "No Connection, Check Signal Cable" on the screen?	Check the signal cable connection.
	If the power is on, reboot the computer to see the initial screen (the login screen).	If the initial screen(the login screen) appears, boot the computer in the applicable mode(the safe mode for Windows 95/98/2000/NT/XP) and then change the frequency of the video card. (Refer to the Preset Display Modes). If the initial screen (the login screen) does not appear, contact your dealer.
	Can you see "Video mode not supported" on the screen?	You can see this message when the signal from the video card exceeds the maximum resolution and frequency that the monitor can properly handle. Adjust the maximum resolution and frequency that the monitor can properly handle.
	There is no image on the screen. Is the power indicator on the monitor blinking at 1 second intervals?	The monitor is in Power Saver mode. Press a key on the keyboard or move the mouse to activate the monitor and restore the image on the screen.

Troubleshooting

Check List

Symptom	Check list	Solution
The image on the screen is shaking.	Check the monitor configuration to see if it is in Interlace Mode. (Interlace Mode: Vertical frequency 43Hz, 87Hz(i),etc).	The signal from the video card exceeds the maximum resolution and frequency of the monitor.
	Are there any magnetic products such as a power adapter, speaker or a high voltage wire near by?	Move the monitor away from anything that can create a strong magnetic field.
	Is the voltage stable?	The screen image can appear to shake or vibrate at a particular time of day due to low supply voltage.
The screen image can also appear to shake or vibrate if there is a problem with the video card or the computer's main board.		
The screen shows strange colors or just black and white.	Is the screen displaying only one color as if looking at the screen through a cellophane paper?	Check the signal cable connection. Make sure the video card is fully inserted in it's slot.
	Have the screen colors become strange after running a program or due to a crash between applications?	Reboot the computer.
	Has the video card been set properly?	Set the video card by referring to the video card manual.
The screen suddenly has become unbalanced.	Have you changed the video card or the drivers?	Adjust screen image position and size using the OSD.
	Have you adjusted the resolution or frequency to the monitor?	Adjust the resolution and frequency at the video card.

Symptom	Check list	Solution
The screen is out of focus or OSD cannot be adjusted.	Have you adjusted the resolution or frequency to the monitor?	Adjust the resolution and frequency at the video card. (Refer to the Preset Display Modes)
LED is blinking but no images on the screen.	Is the frequency properly adjusted when checking the Display Timing on the menu?	Adjust the frequency properly by referring to the video card manual and the Preset Display Modes.
There are only 16 colors shown on the screen. The screen colors have changed after changing the video card.	Have the Windows colors been set properly?	For Windows95/98: Set the colors properly at the Control Panel, Display Settings.
	Has the video card been set properly?	Set the video card by referring to the video card manual.
There is a message that reads Unrecognized monitor, Plug & Play (VESA DDC) monitor found.	Have you installed the monitor drivers?	Find updated monitor driver in our web site http://www.swedx.com .
	See the video card manual to see if the Plug & Play (VESA DDC) function can be supported.	Install the monitor driver according to the Driver Installation Instructions.

Check the following items if there is trouble with the monitor.

1. Check if the power cord and the cable are properly connected to the computer.
2. Check if the computer beeps more than 3 times when booting.
(If it does, request an after-service for the main board of the computer.)
3. If you installed a new video card or if you assembled the PC, check if the installed the adapter (video) driver and the monitor driver.
4. Check if the scanning ratio of the video screen is set at 75Hz or 85Hz.
(Do not exceed 60Hz when using the maximum resolution.)
5. If you have problems in installing the adapter (video) driver, boot the computer in Safe Mode, remove the Display Adapter at the Control Panel, System, Device Administrator and then reboot the computer to reinstall the adapter (video) driver.

Note: If problems repeatedly occur, contract an authorized service center.

Q & A

Question	Answer
How can I change the frequency?	Frequency can be changed by reconfiguring the video card. Note that video card support can vary, depending on the version of the driver used. (Refer to the computer or the video card manual for details.)
How can I adjust the resolution?	Windows 95/98/2000/NT/XP: Set the resolution at the Control Panel, Display, Setting. Windows 3.1: Change the resolution and the colors using the VGA Utility provided by the video card. Contact the video card manufacture for details.
How can I set the Power Saving function?	For Windows 95/98/2000/NT/XP: Set the function at BIOS-SETUP of the computer or the screen saver. (Refer to Windows/Computer Manual). Windows 3.1: Set the function using the VGA Utility provided by the video card.
How can I clean the outer case/LCD panel?	Disconnect the power cord and then clean the monitor with a soft cloth, using either a cleaning solution or plain water. Do not leave any remains of the detergent nor scratch the case. Do not allow any water to go inside the monitor.

This monitor can be installed on any Plug & Play compatible system. Interaction of the monitor and computer systems will provide the best operating conditions and monitor settings. In most cases, monitor installation will proceed automatically, unless the user wishes to select alternate settings.

PowerSaver

This monitor has a built-in power management system called PowerSaver. This system saves energy by switching your monitor into a low-power mode when it has not been used for a certain amount of time. The monitor automatically returns to normal operation when you move the computers mouse or press a key on the keyboard. For energy conservation, turn your monitor OFF when it is not needs, or when leaving it unattended for long periods. The PowerSaver system operates with a VESA DPMS compliant video card installed in your computer. Use a software utility installed on your computer to set up this feature.

Information

Terms

Dot Pitch

The image on a monitor is composed of red, green and blue dots. The closer the dots, the higher the resolution. The distance between two dots of the same color is called the Dot Pitch. Unit: mm

Vertical Frequency

The screen must be redrawn several times per second in order to create and display an image for the user. The frequency of this repetition per second is called Vertical Frequency or Refresh Rate. Unit: Hz.

Example: If the same light repeats itself 60 times per second, this is regarded as 60 Hz. In this case, flickering of the screen can be detected. To avoid this problem, there is a Flicker-free Mode using a vertical frequency over 70 Hz.

Horizontal Frequency

The time to scan one line connecting the right edge to the left edge of the screen horizontally is called Horizontal Cycle. The inverse number of the Horizontal Cycle is called Horizontal Frequency. Unit: kHz

Interlace and Non-Interlace Methods

Showing the horizontal lines of the screen from the top to the bottom in order is called the Non- Interlace method while showing odd lines and then even lines in turn is called the Interlace method. The Non- Interlace method is used for the majority of monitors to ensure a clear image. The Interlace method is the same as that used in TVs.

Plug & Play

This is a function that provides the best quality screen for the user by allowing the computer and the monitor to exchange information automatically. This monitor follows the international standard VESA DDC for the Plug & Play function.

Resolution

The number of horizontal and vertical dots used to compose the screen image is called resolution. This number shows the accuracy of the display. High resolution is good for performing multiple tasks as more image information can be shown on the screen.

Example: If the resolution is 1024 x 768, this means the screen is composed of 1024 horizontal dots (horizontal resolution) and 768 vertical lines (vertical resolution).

Information

For Better Display

1. Adjust computer resolution and screen injection rate (refresh rate) in control panel of computer as described below to enjoy the best quality of picture. You can have an uneven quality of picture in the screen if the best quality of picture is not provided in TFT-LCD.

Resolution: 1024 x 768

Vertical frequency (refresh rate): 60 Hz

2. TFT LCD panel manufactured by using advanced semiconductor technology with precision of 99.999% above is used for this product. But the pixels of RED, GREEN, BLUE and WHITE color seem to be bright sometimes or some of black pixels could be seen. This is not from bad quality and you can use it without uneasiness. For example, the number of TFT LCD pixels that is contained in the 15" are 2,359,296.
3. When you clean the monitor and the panel outside, please apply the recommended small amount of cleaner by using soft and dry cloth and polish it. Let LCD area not to be forced but to be scrubbed out softly. If excessive force is applied, you can have a stain on it.
